Key takeaways:

- The biggest risk to the long term success of your company is busy.
- When you don't have time to properly clarify expectations, it results in disappointment
 and often more work. When you don't take the time to coach your people, it results in a
 lack of progress.
- Be cautious of the disease of busyness. Busy has a gravitational pull that takes us out of intentional action and into a mindless routine.
- Being busy is strangely comfortable. It is the illusion that we are effective. If we do not pause and ask ourselves what is most important, we might not be effective.
- Delegating can be a powerful way to develop your people and enroll them in their own growth.
